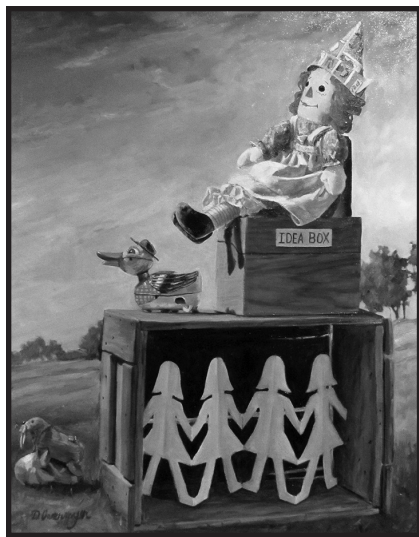

The exhibition for the 75th Anniversary of the Northern Indiana Artists (group) continues **through July 9** in celebration of the museum's 38th Anniversary. Curator Brian Byrn has organized 105 works representing 72 members of NIA. Works in all media that represent people, places, & things help define the artistic purpose of the group—*"to create, exhibit, & educate the public about art."* The educational aspect mirrors the museum's mission in providing this exhibition experience for residents of Michiana. 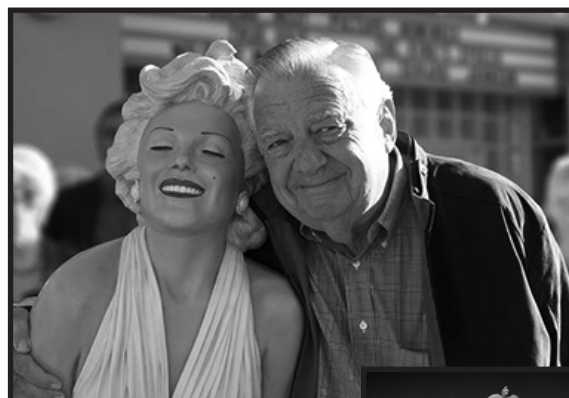


### **Seward Johnson Sculptures on display throughout Elkhart County**

The Midwest Museum of American Art is partnering with the Elkhart County Convention & Visitors Bureau to bring an ***Epic Art Adventure*** to life! Starting May 30 the largest and most significant exhibit (outside of his personal retrospective) of life-size bronze sculptures, including one 25-foot-tall monumental, by internationally acclaimed artist Seward Johnson will be seen at Quilt Gardens and the downtowns of six communities across Elkhart County. Join us at the museum for a three-section visual description of the process that Seward Johnson utilizes when creating one of his sculptures. In this informative display, you will find an original table-top clay model, called a maquette, that is the artist's initial three-D sketch for a piece. This is how the artist develops the pose and gesture of each sculpture. Also included in the exhibit are the tools that the artist used and a photographic display that further explores the age-old technique of the "lost wax method of casting". This ancient art was employed in Michelangelo's time and is still in use today. You will see an example of the plaster, wax and molded parts of a sculpture in-the-making, and finally, the human-scale bronze of *Forever Marilyn*, Johnson's ode to Marilyn Monroe. This is a wonderful exhibit for both adults and children and a chance to explore the various stages, tools and methods used by Mr. Johnson as he makes his art.

To further expand the experience of this summer's exhibition, a video will be on view at the museum which features artist Seward Johnson discussing his artistic career, his inspirations and his life in his own words.

## NO BOUNDARIES:

### *Outsider, Folk & Art of the Self-Taught*

There are a myriad of terms used to describe art of the self-taught—Outsider, folk primitive, and/or vernacular. In essence these terms describe an unbounded attitude towards self-expression; no rules need apply. This exhibit seeks to explore the various approaches to art created by self-taught artists found throughout America and beyond its borders in its closest neighbors in Latin America. Co-curated by Brian Byrn and Todd Hoover, this exhibit will feature a variety of objects from private and public collections. One of the most noteworthy artists in the MMAA collection is the work of Anna Mary Robertson Moses, famously recognized as “Grandma Moses”. Her painting, “Sugarin’ Time” has been one of the three most important works on view in “*The Story of American Art*” in the Main Gallery.

The exhibit **opens on July 14 and continues through October 1**. More information will follow in your next quarterly bulletin....

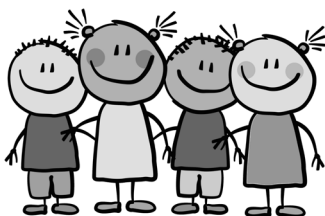

**NEW on VIEW**, a new program to let Museum Members know about select works of American Art normally held in storage or that have been recently donated, has been implemented by Administrative Gallery Coordinator, Randy Roberts. Some of these works find a permanent display spot within the official “*Story of American Art*” in the Main Gallery. Others will be rotated to a special area on a quarterly basis. Roberts will create email announcements for the **New on View** works...be watching for them!

**Thanks** again to John & Sharon Feddersen for donating two important lithographs from 1945 & 1947 by **Ivan Le Loraine Albright (1897-1992)** to the MMAA Collection. The works can be seen currently in the Main Gallery through May 15. Albright was most famous for his painting for the 1945 movie, “*Picture of Dorian Gray*”.

**Janis Langland & Curator Brian Byrn** continue to define the “**Tuck Langland Study Collection**” as a resource for future scholarship. Langland, the most recognized international sculptor of Michiana, is celebrated for his figurative bronzes. The most recent addition to the MMAA collection of over twenty pieces is “**Reaper**” — an heroic pose of a field hand standing with a 19th century scythe. The sculpture of a man pausing to reflect on a hard day’s work can be seen in the Main Gallery beginning May 7 and throughout the year. **Special Thanks** to the artist and his wife for seeing the virtue in developing this important legacy for future generations.

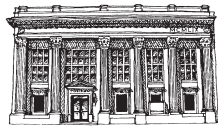
