# The Art of Currency

# The Dr. William Luther Family Coin Collection

The Midwest Museum of American Art is delighted to present this exhibition and gift to the permanent collection from the late Dr. William Luther and Family. Dr. William and Claire Luther became charter members of the museum and served on the Advisory Board since its inception. When the Luthers moved to Elkhart in 1960, Bill had already begun collecting coins which continued with a passion until his death in July of 2008. The exhibit, "The Art of Currency" will feature 2,400 coins and paper monies, valued at over \$100,000, 80% of which are American in origin. The exhibition opens on Friday, December 12 and continues through Sunday, February 22, 2008. A **Special Reception** to honor the late Dr. Luther will be held on **Sunday, December 14** from 1:00 to 4:00 PM.

In a day when nobody seems to care about the aesthetics of "pocket change", the Midwest Museum aims to remind the public that coins were once considered small masterpieces crafted by artists. Because the Midwest Museum of American Art has occupied the former St. Joseph Valley Bank building for almost 30 years, the Luther Family Currency Collection is ideally suited to deliver this message through this cross-cultural display. The exhibit will feature rare examples of early American coins and paper monies highlighting the processes of engraving and casting. Also included in the collection will be examples of mint sets, commemorative coins, and medals. Visitors can compare their collections with the museum's and further their interest in numismatic endeavors. The Midwest Museum of American Art is pleased to preserve this collection in Elkhart for future generations to study and enjoy.

#### The 30th Elkhart Juried Regional...



This year set a record for the number of artists represented in the Elkhart Juried Regional. The judges, Richard Hunt and Richard Roth chose to include 195 artists from the 21-county region. Shown here are several examples of three dimensional work including pieces by Wayne Harshberger (Goshen), Linda Crimson (South Bend), Cynthia Marks (Elkhart), Mark Goertzan (Goshen), and Katharine Schmidt (Elkhart).



Five galleries were used to install the 30th Elkhart Juried Regional including the McClelland-Kirk Gallery on the second floor where the Norman Rockwell collection usually hangs. Seen in this photograph are two "whirly gig" sculptures by Robert Hardt. Several paintings, pastels, and watercolors are grouped together in order for the viewer to draw associations between certain images.

Being on the cutting edge of exhibits the Midwest Museum of American Art hosted a Native American exhibit of Fritz Scholder's work that is now on view in Washington and New York. Now the museum is hosting the "30th Elkhart Juried Regional" that is the largest to date and with over 400 persons at the October 10 opening. We realize how special this regional competition is to area artists.

I sincerely believe that the Midwest Museum of American Art has become a mark of pride and trust. Witness the museum housing the 2058 Elkhart Time Capsule in its vault. I am asking that you remember the Midwest Museum at year's end. True, we are in the toughest of economic times but with a little additional support we can continue our exciting exhibitions, educational and outreach programs.

# **30th Elkhart Juried Regional** continues through December 7

The 30th Elkhart Juried Regional opened with the largest crowd on record on October 10. Over 450 enjoyed the exhibition of 239 works by 195 artists from a twenty-one county region. Awards totaling over \$25,000 were presented—the largest year for awards in museum history! Several of the highlights of the evening's awards reception are illustrated. This exhibition features the most artists from Elkhart (33) ever represented in the history of the competition and the most Elkhart artists in one show to win awards (6). South Bend recorded (8) artists winning awards.


