Frank Dudley, Painter of the Dunes

An Indiana Artist with a love of nature and a passion to preserve it.

The Midwest Museum of American Art presents a special exhibition of 60 paintings by the historically important dunes painter Frank Dudley (1868-1957) for the holidays. The exhibit opens to the public on Friday, December 10, 2010 and continues through Sunday, February 27, 2011. This important exhibit was mounted from the private collections of four Michiana residents represents one of the largest showings of the artist's work.

Frank Dudley dedicated forty years of his professional life as a landscape painter to the promotion of the Indiana Dunes along the southern shore of Lake Michigan. Today, the Indiana Dunes State Park and the encompassing Indiana Dunes National Lake Shore provide state and federal protection for a unique geographical ecosystem. At the turn of the 20th Century the study of ecology was born in the Indiana Dunes as a result of the attention of the Prairie Club who were a group of scientists and artists who saw the rise of industry in the region as a destructive force. Henry Chandler Cowles, a botanist from the University of Chicago, declared that there was, "a dramatic struggle in the spectacular phases," of the dunes. Frank Dudley saw this and painted an ongoing series of the Dunes in all their changing splendor.


Today, the largest public collection of Dudley's paintings can be found in the Indiana State Museum in Indianapolis. Within the region however, many collectors, schools, and libraries purchased the painter's work through the Hoosier Salon and the Chicago Galleries Association, or from the many exhibits the artist was included in at the Art Institute of Chicago. To Michiana residents, the art of Frank Dudley, should represent a major cultural asset that literally changed the environment within which it was created.

The Director's Statement

At a time when everyday brings news of another museum curtailing its hours or another cultural group closing its doors it is a privilege to report that the Midwest Museum of American Art is not forgoing our mission. We recognize the vital role the museum plays in our area and remain dedicated to assuring that the MMAA is a robust and exciting place for American Arts.

The MMAA has had an excellent 31st year. The Ray Howlett Dichroic glass exhibit amazed and astounded our viewers followed by an equally exciting show by Philip Koch on the American Landscape. The Elkhart Juried Regional continued to provide a venue for area artists to show their talents and share in \$31,000 of prizes and purchase awards. Our Holiday exhibit, a *must-see* for anyone who has ever visited the dunes, will be on the painter of the Indiana Dunes, Frank Dudley.

Last year I mentioned the challenges facing the Midwest Museum in the wake of the economic recession and they are no less so than 2009. Rather than look for reductions and redundancies, the staff, volunteers, and I have tried to use the approach to do more to explore new initiatives outside the traditional museum. For example, the Main Gallery with its beautiful bountiful space, has been used for special events and occasions that contribute to our ability to pay our bills as well as introduce the public to our varied Permanent Collection. This use of the MMAA's physical structure is a way to increase intensity of use and to create synergies for the entire community. Finally, we have had to rethink strategies for exhibiting collections: how can works be shown anew? Thanks to our Curator, Brian Byrn, thematic exhibitions that display known works from our Permanent Collection and costing relatively little, have been presented in a new light. Our noontime lectures have focused on these related exhibits. As always I'm grateful for our members and friends' tremendous support of the Midwest Museum. Thank you for believing in our mission and for being such a valued partner in our work. I encourage you to continue with contributions and memberships as an expression of your commitment to our present and our future.




her husband Jack for the artist's turned-wood vessel made of Norfolk pine. Hoinville received three awards overall for his two works in the exhibit.
