Barbara Aubin: Hidden Messages

Three Exhibits Present the Big Picture of an Artist's Contributions to Our Region & the Nation

MMAA is pleased to present three exhibits that contextualize the art of the late Barbara Aubin, a well-known Chicago artist, teacher, & formerly active founding member of the Chicago Chapter of the Women's Caucus of Art. "Barbara Aubin: Hidden Messages", opens Friday, December 9, 2016, and continues through Sunday, February 26, 2017 The second exhibit of, "Works on Paper by Chicago Imagists", shows the internationally recognized efforts of the "Hairy Who" (& other artists) and demonstrates the influences of Surrealism, Outsider Art, and figuration. The third exhibit mounted from the MMAA Permanent Collection helps to place Aubin in context with the growing roster of important women artists of the 20th Century. These exhibits could stand alone but collectively present a much larger national view of 20th Century concepts in art. It should be noted that Aubin's work and personal papers were recently acquired by the Smithsonian Institution's National Museum of American Art & archives. The Midwest Museum of American Art is grateful to the artist, Jackie Moses (Skokie, IL) and Curator Jane Stevens (Chicago) for bringing to our attention the work of Barbara Aubin and helping procure the important cultural contribution of 18 works that will be preserved by MMAA closer to the artist's home for generations to come.

A book containing a collection of essays about Barbara Aubin entitled, "Barbara Aubin, A Lifetime of Art: 1928-2014", was recently published earlier this year by Jane Stevens, Associate Curator of Fine Art, Illinois State Museum Chicago Gallery. The book gives a clear picture of Aubin's accomplishments as a Professor of Art at Chicago State University for over twenty years and her years as an artist, activist, writer, & curator, giving women artists visibility in Chicago.


Stevens will present a gallery talk about Barbara Aubin on Sunday, **December 11**, **at 2:00 PM**. Afterwards books will be available for purchase and will be signed by the author. About the artist, Jane Stevens states, "Elements of water, land, and seascapes seem to float through surreal land-scapes. These dream-like images become very complex and beautiful. The autobiographical surreal worlds (Aubin) created reflected her strong feminist consciousness."

NOV 3 Kaylee Dalton, Elkhart, IN Angie & Jack Welter Purchase Award

Two Fantastic Films for You during December!

DEC 8 "J.M.W. Turner", (30 min)

This National Gallery of Art film explores the preeminent and eccentric English painter's world. Over the course of six decades of the 19th Century he became the leading British artist of his time. His paintings are considered by some art historians to be the precursors of modern expressionism.

DEC 22 "Hidden Messages: The Art of Barbara Aubin"

Curator **Brian Byrn** discusses the exhibit of mixed media artwork by the late Chicago artist. The work was acquired from the Artist's Estate in 2015 and is being shown for the first time at MMAA.

DEC 29 "Parrish Blue", (27 min)

This film was produced in 1967, shortly after the death of the popular American artist/illustrator Maxfield Parrish. Rare footage of his home in Cornish, New York, is seen just as the 96-year old had left it. With narration by his son, Maxfield Parrish, Jr. and artist/friend Norman Rockwell, the film gives a grainy yet engaging portrait using many original paintings at that time.

JAN 5 The Monster Roster & The Hairy Who

The history of Chicago art in the 20th Century is a colorful collection of challenging personal visions that embraced difficult, and at times, odd influences including *l'Art Brut*, a term coined by French artist Jean Dubuffet, Outsider or Primitive art, drawings by children, and art of ethnographic origins.

JAN 12 Defining Surrealism

Beginning in 1922-24, a series of exhibits, a manifesto, and an unusual group of both Americans and European artists delve into the subconscious world of dreams. The work of Sigmund Freud & Carl Jung become important touchstones for these artists. *Surrealism* was the most powerful influence in 20th Century art and still pervades the realm of art in the 21st Century.

JAN 19 Women Artists of the 20th Century

Curator Brian Byrn continues to explore the three special exhibits by highlighting important works by women in the 20th Century from the MMAA Permanent Collection.

JAN 26 "Arcimboldo: Nature & Fantasy", (30 min)

This film looks back in time to a precursor of *Surrealism*, the paintings of Giuseppe Arcimboldo, that dazzled the courts of Europe. His imaginative combinations of fruits, vegetables, & flowers create allegorical portraits of emperors and witty caricatures of their courtiers. His paintings reveal the mind of an artist deeply influenced by the new discoveries in new worlds during the Age of Exploration.
